Welcome to the exhibition Commissioned Images. Photographs by Ruth Hallensleben 1931–1973.

Ruth Hallensleben was a photographer for more than 40 years. She worked for many different factories and took photographs of them. Sometimes she even travelled to other countries to take photos. She also worked

before, during and after the Second World War, which took place between 1939 and 1945. This is why the exhibition includes a few photos of National Socialists, who were known as Nazis for short. The Nazis ruled Germany at that time and inflicted much pain and suffering on people around the world. Some of Ruth Hallensleben's photos show beautiful landscapes; others show destroyed cities after the war.



The questions in this quiz will take you on a voyage of discovery through the exhibition. You'll be able to answer the questions by taking a good look at the photographs. You'll find letters after the correct answers and in the grey boxes. Put these letters together on the last page to reveal the secret word. It will tell you what Ruth Hallensleben's profession was before she became a photographer.




